Royal Horticultural Halls **Exhibition**



What is it? A busy exhibition venue that caters for anything from exhibitions, banquets and classic car auctions to product launches and conferences.

What's it got? Four separate spaces for hire. The Lawrence Hall provides an Art Deco setting that can host up to 1,800 guests, while the smaller Lindley Hall is a classic Edwardian structure, complete with a glass roof that can be blacked out if needed. The space holds up to 650 guests for a reception. Alongside these are the 500-capacity Glasshouse and the Conference Centre, which can accommodate 200 delegates.

Best event of 2008? Among the most impressive events were *BBC Question Time*, The Prince of Wales's May Day Summit and the British Fashion Awards.

Last refurbishment or newest facility? The venue has installed acoustic roller blinds, acoustic banners, black-out blinds, a reversible drape system and intelligent lighting.
